PERENNIALS

1. **BORDER CARNATION** - *Zing Rose* (Dianthus) forms mats of dark green foliage with rose-red flowers, ht. 6", 3" plug \$3
2. **LAVENDER** - *Hidcote*, compact gray-green foliage with deep purple flowers, ht. 12", 3" plug \$3
3. **SHASTA DAISY** - *Becky* (Leucanthemum) large 4" white daisy flowers with yellow center, very strong grower and heavy bloomer, dark green foliage remains attractive during the summer heat, excellent cut flower, ht. 28-36", 3" plug \$3
4. **FALSE SPIREA** - *Erica* (Astilbe) early-mid, bronze tinged foliage matures to green, tall upright plumes of light pink flowers, ht. 26", 3-5 eye \$3
5. **FOXGLOVE** - *Camelot Lavender* (Digitalis) vigorous plants with strong upright stem and huge lavender flowers with showy burgundy speckled throat flairs outward & radiate around the flower spike, ht. 24-30", 3" plug \$3
6. **CRANESBILL** - *Johnson's Blue* (Geraniums) very popular variety with violet-blue, long-flowering, one of the best blue geraniums, ht. 14-18", 3" plug \$4
7. **DAYLILY** - *Chicago Apache* (Hemerocallis) mid-late, 5" ruffled flowers, sturdy tetraploid plants, extremely sunfast color, fiery scarlet-red, ht. 30", bareroot \$5
8. **RUSSIAN SAGE** - *atriplicifolia* (Perovskia) silver foliage, lavender-blue flowers, exceptionally long bloom time, mid-summer into fall, ht. 36-48", 3" plug \$4
9. **MEADOW SAGE** - *May Night* (Salvia) deep purple flowers, compact plant, ht. 18", 3" plug \$3
10. **PINCUSHION FLOWER** - *Butterfly Blue* (Scabiosa) prolific bloomer, compact mounds of gray-green lacy foliage with wispy stems of lavender-blue pincushion flowers, ht. 12/18" 3" plug \$4
11. **BELLFLOWER** - *Blue Chip* (Campanula) Very floriferous and upward facing cup-shaped blue flowers, blooming late spring into summer, ht. 8", 3" plug \$3
12. **BELLFLOWER** - *White Chip* (Campanula) cup-shaped white flowers ht. 8", 3" plug \$3
13. **LENTEN ROSE** - *Royal Heritage Strain* (Helleborus) selected for it wide color range, flowers come in red, pink,

ORNAMENTAL GRASSES

14. **FEATHER REED GRASS** - *Karl Forester* (Calamagrostic) Deep green foliage, feathery tan plumes #3 container \$18
15. **MAIDEN GRASS** - *Graziella* (Miscanthus sin) Narrow green foliage, early bloomer 6-7' #3 container \$18

GROUND COVERS & VINES



16. **JUNIPER** - (Juniperus horizontalis 'Wiltonii') *Blue Rug*, Intense silvery-blue foliage assumes a light purplish tinge in winter, spread 6-8', ht. 4-6", 3-6" pot \$3
17. **CLEMATIS** - *Ernest Markham*, bright magenta-red, 5-6" flowers, strong and vigorous grower, most popular red bloom, July-Sept, ht. 12-15', 2.5" pot \$9
18. **CREeping PHLOX** - *Emerald Blue*, light blue flowers, dark green glossy foliage, ht. 4-6", 3" plug \$4
19. **PERIWINKLE** - *Bowles Variety* (Vinca) dark green leaves with deep blue flowers, more mounding type than rooting along the stem, ht. 6-8", 2.5" pot \$3

ORNAMENTAL TREES & SHRUBS

20. **WHITE FLOWERING DOGWOOD** (Cornus florida) Dense lustrous, green foliage, turning bright scarlet in the fall. Clusters of white flowers up to 5 inches in diameter bloom in May. Bright red berries in clusters in the fall This is considered to be the best ornamental of all trees. ht. 40', 8-10" pot \$6
21. **FORSYTHIA** - *Lynwood Gold*, Very fast, upright growth, one of the best plants for flowering screen. Deep golden flower, spread 5', ht. 7', 10-12" pot \$4
22. **WASHINGTON HAWTHORN** (Crataegus phaenopyrum) Clusters of small, single, white flowers, Bright red fruit fall-winter, spread 20-25', ht. 25-30', 1-2', 3-yr. seedling \$3
23. **SWEET CRABAPPLE** (malus coronaria) a deciduous tree with a short trunk and a wide spreading head of grayish braches, spread 15-25', ht. 20-30', 1-2' pot \$6

24. **SHADBLOW SERVICEBERRY** (*Amelanchier Canadensis*) one of the first native trees to bloom in early spring, covered in white flowers in racemes, berrylike fruit are maroon-red. ht. 25-30', 8-12" *pot* **\$6**
25. **AZALEA** - *Tradition*, pink flowers, #1 container **\$12**
26. **AZALEA** - *Girard Crimson*, red flowers #1 container **\$12**
27. **VIBURNUM** - *Blue Muffin*, (Arrowwood *Viburnum*) glossy green leaves, intense blue fruit, #1 container **\$12**
28. **VIBURNUM** - *Redwing*, (American Cranberry *Viburnum*), red tinted new foliage, persistent red fruit, #3 container **\$18**
29. **HYDRANGEA** - *Pink Diamond*, (Hardy *Hydrangea*) White flowers age to rich pink, #3 container **\$18**
30. **HYDRANGEA** - *Nikko Blue* (Bigleaf *Hydrangea*) Blue mop-head type flowers, #3 container **\$18**
31. **HIBISCUS** - *Lavendar Chiffon*, large single lavender flowers with lacey center, #3 container **\$18**
32. **HIBISCUS** - *White Chiffon*, large single white flowers with lacey center, #3 container **\$18**
33. **NORTHERN BAYBERRY** (*Myrica pensylvanica* 'Bayview') Also known as Candleberry. Lustrous, deep green foliage is semi-evergreen. Very aromatic when crushed. A very ornamental shrub, growing 5 to 12 feet height and spread. Noted for its waxy-gray berries, fall and winter, from which candles are made. Spread 5-12', ht. 5-12', #1 container **\$12**
34. **BEACH PLUM** - Good on sand dunes or for screens & edges, edible fruit used for jelly, #1 container **\$12**
35. **RUGOSA ROSE** - Hardy, reddish-pink blooms in summer, red fruit in fall, excellent erosion control, #1 container **\$12**

EVERGREENS & HARDWOODS

36. **AMERICAN ARBORVITAE** natural choice for windbreaks, landscaping. 2 yr. 6-8" bareroot 25 for **\$35**
37. **BALSAM FIR** -  The original, old fashion Christmas trees, fragrant. 3 yr. 12-16" bareroot 5 for **\$30**
38. **NORWAY SPRUCE** -  - fastest growing of the spruces, dark green needles. 2yr. 10-14", bareroot 25 for **\$35**
39. **CANADIAN HEMLOCK** (*Tsuga Canadensis*) often acclaimed the most beautiful of evergreens. Lacy, graceful growth. Short, soft light yellow-green needles in the spring changing to glossy dark green. Can be pruned to maintain a height from 2-12 ft. Spread 35', ht. 70', ht. 8-10" *pot* **\$4**



FRUITS & VEGETABLES

40. **BLUEBERRY** - late - *Jersey*, bareroot **\$10**
41. **BLUEBERRY** - mid - *Blueray*, bareroot **\$10**
42. **BLUEBERRY** - early - *Patriot*, bareroot **\$10**

Recommendation for Blueberries
Plant 2 varieties of blueberries for pollination

43. **STRAWBERRIES** - *Allstar* - large berries with superb quality and flavor, late mid-season 25 for **\$10**
44. **ASPARAGUS** - *Jersey Supreme* - high yields, disease resistant, one yr. crowns, 25 for **\$15**

BEACH GRASS

45. **"CAPE" AMERICAN BEACH GRASS** Easy to plant and spreads rapidly. Plant 2-3 culms 18" apart, **before April 15th** for best results. American Beach Grass is the most effective way to stabilize dunes and areas of shifting sand in coastal areas. Please check with your town conservation commission before planting beach grass along coastal areas. Due to the lateness of our Pick-up Day, beach grass may be ordered and picked up at the West Wareham office.

47. **FERTILIZER TABLETS** This unique fertilizing tablet is designed to root feed evergreen and hardwood seedlings and trees, shrubs, roses, fruit, flower and shade trees, for up to two years. It is easy to use, completely non-burning and promotes vigorous growth. The tablet is simply dropped into the hole at the root zone of the plant at planting time. It releases fertilizer slowly for a two year period. These tablets do not dissolve by water, but depend upon the action of soil bacteria to convert their nutrients to a form that can be used by plants. Tablets are 10 grams each, 20% Nitrogen, 10% Phosphoric Acid, 5% Potash.
